

Class - Year 9	Term 2 - Learning Weeks 1-2
ENGLISH 1	<p>There has been a specific book created for 9E1 that corresponds with the study of the play 'Romeo and Juliet'. These can be collected from the front office. As well as this, there has been a google classroom created where regular updates will be added. All students in the class have been invited to join through their education email addresses. The 2013 version of the film is also accessible through youtube, clickview and on SBS world movies if that helps with the understanding of the play.</p>
ENGLISH 2	<p>Students will be provided a booklet on the Romeo and Juliet unit with work for a two week cycle. There will be videos on Google Classroom to assist students in understanding and going through the booklets. All students have received an invite to Google Classroom. Alternatively they can join using the code: neremam.</p>
ENGLISH 3	<p>Students will be provided with a booklet on Romeo and Juliet unit with work for a two week cycle. There will be lessons posted on Google Classroom to assist students in understanding and going through the booklet.</p>
MATHEMATICS	<p>All students have been issued with a booklet on consumer arithmetic. All classes have been invited to a google classroom. 9 Maths 1 will also be doing some text book work which will be delivered on a daily basis via the google classroom. All year 9 students need to check their emails through the department portal, and join their respective classroom.</p>
SCIENCE 1	<p>Year 9 will be starting a new topic – Waves and Light. HSIE	<p>Students are continuing with the Geography topic, Sustainable Biomes, booklet 2 for this unit is available. Booklet 2 consists of two weeks worth of activities organised lesson by lesson. During this booklet students will be examining the interaction between biomes and agriculture both in Australia and internationally. This will require students to consider how biomes dictate agricultural opportunities, are modified for the purpose of agriculture, and impact</p>

	humans and the environment locally and globally. Additional extension activities are incorporated into the booklet and will be posted on the Year 9 Google Classroom.
AB STUDIES	Students are to continue working through their learning booklets. There are many activities included based on the current unit 'Aboriginal Autonomy', including their assessment task which is due Friday 8th May.
AGRICULTURE	A booklet about Beef Production has been given to all students. The booklet contains a range of tasks covering various aspects of beef production. As a practical activity, students are to start growing their own productive vegie patch. The completed booklet must be returned at the beginning of Week 3 for marking.
ARCHAEOLOGY	Students beginning a new unit on Pirates. They are learning through a combination of Google classroom and booklets. All students have been given relevant log on details, either in person or via electronic communication, and each student needs to be checking these platforms each day.
COMMERCE	Students are beginning a new topic this term. The name of the topic is 'Political Involvement'. The work for this unit will be completed in booklets, which are now available. Booklet 1 consists of two weeks' activities. During this time, students will be examining features of government structures and investigating political processes. Additional activities to extend and enrich student learning will be posted on the Google Classroom.
DRAMA	Students are commencing a new unit on Comedy and Radio plays. Students should complete the work-booklet and engage with the extension activities which will be available through the Google Classroom.
FOOD TECHNOLOGY	Students will receive a work book and a recipe book about Food for Special Occasions. Students need to complete some written and research tasks, as well as practical cooking tasks during the two-week period. An assessment task will be sent out later. The completed work book must be returned at the beginning of Week 3 for marking.
INDUSTRIAL TECH TIMBER	All students will be supplied with a Timber booklet. It contains readings and exercises about woodworking machine safety and various types of machinery and tools. Completed booklets must be returned at the beginning of Week 3 for marking
INDUSTRIAL TECH METAL	All students will be supplied with a Metal booklet. It contains readings and exercises about hand tools and Oxy-Acetylene welding. A schedule is included to guide students with regards to their time allocation for the work. Completed booklets must be returned at the beginning of Week 3 for marking.
MEDIA PUBLISHING	Media Publishing students will be receiving a learning tasks booklet which contains two design tasks. The first is the 'Visual Dictionary' collage task, where students are asked to consider all the ways a word from the dictionary could

The second is the first of two digital mobile phone photography tasks where students are asked to take three different digital photographs with their mobile phones in three differing photography styles. These tasks can either be emailed to the teacher when complete by the due date or returned with their work booklets to school for feedback.</p>
MUSIC	<p>Students will receive a booklet with activities about Film Music and Composition (music theory). The work is structured into 6 lessons and covers Weeks 1 and 2 of Term 2. The booklet contains information about a practical activity – recording a song as part of an online orchestra. Students have been given individual instrument parts at the correct level, and can start practising these. There are backtracks for practicing purposes as well. The recording will start much later in Term 2 only. All students can access the material on Google Classroom where further support and extension activities will be provided. Students also have an assessment task due on Monday 11 May. Details are in the Music pack. The completed booklet must be returned at the beginning of Week 3 for marking.</p>
PASS	<p>Year 9 are starting the unit of Sports Coaching. This unit of work will be looking at the qualities of a coach and the different styles of coaching. Students will also be learning how to structure an effective coaching session to get the most from an athlete and also designing a season long training program, including pre-season, in-season and post-season activities.</p>
PDHPE	<p>Year 9 is starting the topic of “Close friends”. Students are learning about contraceptives, STI’s, consent, peer and sexual pressure, positive and negative relationships, domestic violence and support networks. This unit of work goes for ten weeks. For practical activities, we are advising that students stick to the recommended daily guidelines for physical activity, which is 60 minutes of moderate to vigorous physical activity.</p>
VISUAL ARTS	<p>Year 9 students studying elective Visual Arts will be supplied with learning booklets each fortnight. Students also have access to learning content via google Classroom, where they can complete tasks and submit work online. Practical tasks are to be completed at home and will require some basic equipment (pencils, glue, scissors, paper). Specialised equipment will be supplied to students in each fortnight’s package.</p>
